We started last week by setting up tents, but we had to take a break after the most recent earthquake because people were in a real state of panic. In Hatav Samandağı, there were some people with guns who tried to threaten one of our brothers who was trying to set up tents. Since we didn't want to put our teams at risk, we decided that it would be a good idea to take a break from tent pitching for a while. Even though we didn't pitch the tents ourselves, we invited people who were in need to the church and they pitched their own tents. So far we have been involved with the pitching of about 65 tents.

During this time, we also moved the house of two brothers from the church and some of the church's belongings to a safer place.



When one of our friends was going to set up the tents, his friend saw the logo of the Protestant churches and asked for one, saying 'please give me one and I will put it up on my shop'. Later we saw that this man had indeed put the logo of the Protestant churches up in his shop.

When we set up these tents, everyone knew that we were Christians. When we told them that we would come to drink tea with them after we had set up a new living space, they smiled and said 'you are always welcome'. Seeing that people were grateful for the church's help gave us hope.



In the center of Adiyaman, they prepare food and hygiene packages and then distribute them to those in need.

Brothers serving in the hospital cafeteria in Besni, Adıyaman continue to serve food and drinks to patients, attendants and employees. Some of the brothers overheard the earthquake victims saying 'They are serving very well' as they left with a cup of tea in their hands.

Our brothers and sisters there have gained everyone's appreciation. We heard the chief physician of the hospital saying to them, "You are clean, respectful, quiet and serve in a very good way. May God be pleased with you!" We thank the Lord!
